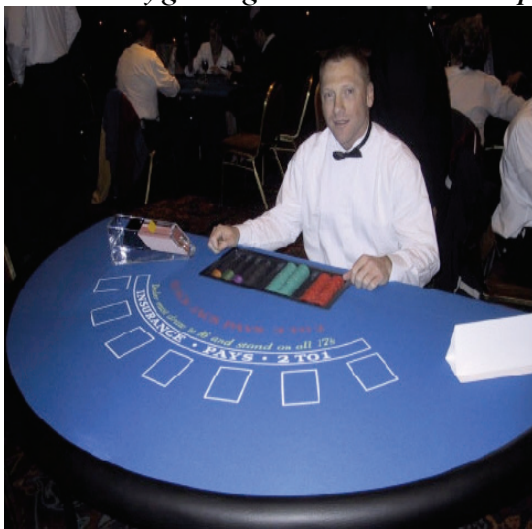




Casino Information Sheet

Formats: Redemption Tickets for playing chips are to be handed out at registration table or other arrangements made. In all formats guests will be required to take the redemption ticket to any gaming table to receive their gaming chips. Also, we typically enforce a \$100 maximum bet which is released the last ½ hour of play meaning for the last half hour there is no maximum bet. Minimum bet is \$1. If client chooses to not enforce a maximum bet then the maximum number of raffle tickets any single guest can win is 200.

- 1) ***Free Play:*** This is your ice breaker format. Use when your client is looking for a great way to get their guests interacting amongst each or just an adult activity to fill dead time in their event agenda. Guests will start off with a designated amount determined by you and the client. To receive chips the guests will need to take the redemption ticket to any gaming table. From there it is free play and they will follow the rules of each game/table. No prizes are handed out at the end of gaming. If the client would like they can still recognize the chip leader(s).
- 2) ***Auction:*** This format is a competitive format. Players start with a designated amount determined by you and the client. The guests must take the redemption ticket to any gaming table to receive their playing chips. From there guests play by the



rules of the table. They are allowed to move from table to table at their discretion. At the end of gaming players cash in all of their earnings to any dealer. In return for the chips they will receive a cash-out slip that states their overall earnings for the night. Once cash out is completed the auctioning of prizes begins. If a player bids on a prize that goes for \$2000 but their earnings for the night is \$3000 there will be no change

given. At that point they would be considered to have spent all of their money. Guest

can combine earnings to create one large pool of money. Auction ends when the last prize is gone.

- 3) **Raffle:** *This format is a competitive format. Players start with a designated amount determined by you and the client. The guests must take the redemption ticket to any gaming table to receive their playing chips. From there they play by the rules of the table. Guests are allowed to move from table to table at their discretion. At the end of gaming guests will take their earnings to any dealer for cash out. In return for their chips they will receive a cash-out slip that states their overall earnings for the night. Once they receive a cash out slip they will take the cash out slip to the raffle ticket/prize area. You should discuss where the raffle ticket/prize area will be setup with your client. The guests will turn in their cash out slip and in return they will receive raffle tickets. You need to determine the ratio for the chips to raffle ticket exchange. It should be determined off of what your starting money is. So, if your starting money is \$300 it should be 1 raffle ticket for every \$300. Non Gamblers should take their redemption ticket straight to the raffle ticket/prize area to receive their raffle ticket(s). This is the most popular format and the one that is most user friendly. It gives every one a shot at a prize...even the non-gamblers.*



- 4) **Chip Leader:** *This is a competitive format and similar to tournament style. Players start with a designated amount and they receive their chips by taking their redemption ticket to any gaming table. From there they play by the rules of the table. Guests are allowed to move from table to table at their discretion. At the end of gaming they turn in their*

earning to any dealer and in return they will receive a cash-out slip that states their overall earnings. The guests take their cash out slip to the Pit Boss who will be stationed in the prize area (you should discuss where this will be located with your client). The Pit Boss will then pull the chip leaders from the cash out slips. The amount of chip leaders pulled will be determined by the number of prizes.

Chip Denominations:

Yellow	\$1
Purple	\$5
Green	\$25
White	\$100
Black	\$500
